Arizona leaders to visit Utah about implications of Arizona's enforcement-only immigration law

SALT LAKE CITY – Todd Landfried is a partner at Southwest Policy Advisors, LLC, and spokesman for Arizona Employers for Immigration Reform. Lydia Guzman is president of *Somos America* and *Respect Respecto*. They will visit Utah from February 10–12 to talk with policy makers and the public about the implications of SB 1070 in Arizona. They will address the consequences of the immigration enforcement-only bill on the economy and public safety. The purpose of their visit is to share their experience with state immigration enforcement and the resulting unintended consequences of state-implemented immigration policies in Arizona.

The luncheon will host a constructive presentation and discussion on the various economic implications of state immigration enforcement in Arizona, the potential impact of a similar bill in Utah, and what community and business leaders can do to protect the economic interests of Utah.
